Collaborative Family Practice (CFP) is an interest-based approach to negotiations dealing with matrimonial disputes and is a process that is undertaken outside of court proceedings, with a commitment to resolve the issues out of court. CPF aims to assist couples to reach an agreement, which meets the needs of all parties, thus avoiding the acrimony caused by the litigation process. It involves specially trained CFP lawyers and other family specialists such as financial advisers and child specialists as necessary, assisting the parties to negotiate an agreement that suits the family.
